

2021-2022 SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS (SAP) APPEAL PROCESS INSTRUCTIONS

If you experienced mitigating circumstances and would like to submit an appeal, you may follow the steps below to complete the process:

- 1) Please log into asurams.verifymyfafs.com. If you are a New/Returning user, login with your ASU email/username and password. Please note that you **MUST** be an admitted student to begin the SAP appeal process. Please contact 229-500-4358 if you have difficulty logging in.
- 2) Once logged in you will see an outstanding task titled "SAP Appeal". Click on the task and then click "view form".
- 3) Read the instructions so you know what must be contained within your statement and the documentation required to ensure that your appeal will be reviewed. Once you have read the instructions, click "Continue".
- 4) Complete necessary demographic information. Once demographics are entered, click "Continue".
- 5) Read the submission instructions to acknowledge your responsibilities.
- 6) Complete your written statement (statements **MUST** include what mitigating circumstances occurred that prevented you from making satisfactory academic progress **AND** what has changed that will enable you to meet satisfactory academic progress in the future). Once your statement is entered, check the box "I will provide supporting 3rd party documentation" and click "Continue". **Please note: Appeals without supporting 3rd party documentation will not be considered complete and will not be reviewed.**
- 7) Enter the E-sign password to sign your appeal and click "E-sign". Once signed you will be directed back to a main page.
- 8) Click "Upload" to add your 3rd party documentation.
- 9) Once the appeal form is E-signed and all 3rd party documentation is uploaded, click "Submit" to submit your appeal for review.

Your appeal form and documentation must be submitted electronically using the steps listed above. **No paper appeal forms or documentation will be accepted in the office.** All appeal forms and supporting documentation must be received no later than the established appeal deadline date for each term. Please be mindful that incomplete appeals will not be reviewed and appeals received after the deadline will not be reviewed until the committee meets the following term.

Once a decision has been rendered on your appeal, the appeal decision will be made available to you via your ASU RAM Email and/or Banner Web Account. If your appeal is granted, you will be placed on a financial aid academic plan or financial aid probation. Your continued eligibility for financial aid will be based on your successful completion of the terms of your probation or academic plan. The Academic Plan will be designed to help you reach the minimum standard of progress within a reasonable amount of time. If you meet the terms of your Academic Plan you will continue to receive aid for the subsequent term. If you fail to meet the requirements of the Academic Plan or fail to meet the minimum Satisfactory Academic Progress Standards, you

will be placed on financial aid suspension and will not be eligible to receive additional financial aid assistance until you regain eligibility.
